1. Freedom From Thirst and Hunger			
 Fosters will be required to provide fresh water and a nutritionally balanced diet. 			
2. Freedom From Discomfort			
 Fosters will be required to provide bedding in a safe, healthy living environment free 			
from the elements.			
3. Freedom From Pain, Injury, or Diseas	se		

• Fosters will be required to take reasonable measures to keep the foster safe from harm, avoid exposing them to undue risk, seek medical attention if needed, insure they get all required medications, and keep them current on all vaccines.

4. Freedom To Express Normal Behavior

• Fosters will be required to make sure the foster is given plenty of activity, exercise, and attention in order and maintain a general physical and mental health.

5. Freedom From Fear and Distress

• Fosters will be required to avoid mental suffering and stress and take reasonable measures to give the foster a safe place.
